WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

Literacy:

Word Study - In May, we will study vowel digraphs, blends, consonant patterns, and suffixes.

Reading Workshop - In May we continue to study unit 4: Planting for the Future. Readers will understand who is telling a story and how that shapes the story. Learners will explore content to understand that life is a process of growth, change, and learning in which important lessons are taught from generation to generation.

Writers understand that narratives contain characters and sequenced events.

*Please continue to read daily with your child - encourage him/her to use print strategies to figure out difficult words and retell the story in sequence (beginning, middle, end). Encourage them to ask questions and then discuss possible responses to their auestions.

Writing Workshop - students will compose a narrative with details and a sequence of events.

Math:

Unit 10 - Developing understanding of linear measurement and measuring lengths as iterating length units. Domain: Measurement and Data, Represent Data We will be working with analog clocks. Please encourage your child to tell time using an analog clock. Unit 11 - Reasoning about attributes of, and composing and decomposing geometric shapes. Domain: Geometry
