WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

<u>Literacy:</u>

Reading — We will begin our Nonfiction Workshop. The skills addressed for the unit will focus on determining importance, questioning and synthesis. In this workshop, students will be reading a variety of factual texts, including articles and informational texts.

*Please note the format of our reading response homework will change to responding to nonfiction texts. You may want to visit your local library or bookstore to ensure your child has plenty of nonfiction resources to read at home.

Word Study – We are continuing to work with Words Their Way differentiated weekly spelling lists. We are also continuing to use our Word a Day Program and weekly content specific vocabulary list.

Math:

This month students will study concepts in Unit Four, which focuses on decimals and their uses, as well as metric units of length. Some of the skills we will address are decimal place value, comparing and ordering decimals, estimating with decimals, decimal addition and subtraction, and using decimals to convert metric units of length.

*Tip: Although Unit Three is complete, please continue to study the multiplication times tables nightly with your child, as students will need instant recall of these facts for future units.

Social Studies:

We will begin Unit 2: Three Worlds Meet. Chapter 3 will be covered this month. The main focuses of Chapter 3 are the first explorers and the development of colonies. We will take a close look at life in the Dutch colony of New Amsterdam. We will also examine life in New York colony under English rule.

Science:

This month Mrs. Ferrezza's students will be learning about the water cycle, evaporation, condensation, and water tension. They will also learn how water reacts on different surfaces.
