WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

<u>Literacy:</u>

Reading - We will be wrapping up our study of informational nonfiction texts. Students will be presenting the information they learned in the form of a five minute newscast that will be videotaped. In addition, we will be starting our Narrative Nonfiction Unit in which students will be participating in book clubs based on their reading level. They will also be reading an autobiography at home to reinforce the skills learned in reading workshop. This will allow students to compare and contrast informational nonfiction to narrative nonfiction.

Word Study - We are continuing to practice our spelling skills in class. We are also continuing to use our Word a Day Program and our Content Based Skill Assessment to build our vocabulary.

Writing Workshop - Students will be publishing their feature articles on a topic. They will use the information in these articles to write their newscast presentation. Next up, students will be writing a persuasive essay based on the information gathered in their narrative nonfiction book clubs.

Math:

This month, students will study concepts in unit 5. Unit 5 begins with two lessons that focus on extending multiplication skills, in preparation for the introduction of the partial products and lattice methods of multiplication. Unit 5 also emphasizes reading, writing, and using large numbers, including the use of powers of 10 to represent large numbers.

Social Studies:

We will continue our work in Chapter 4 this month. The main focus of Chapter 4 are the thirteen colonies: How colonies were started, the characteristics of the colonies, and a focus on what life was like for those living in the New York Colony. We will also begin Chapter 5 after our unit assessment. The main focus of Chapter 5 is the American Revolution: How the colonists resisted English rule and the role of New York in the Revolutionary War.

Science:

This month Mrs. Ferrezza's students are learning about the properties of water. They are learning about evaporation, condensation, and measuring the volume of liquids.
