

## Summer Reading Assignment for Incoming Seniors – English 7/8 - Mr. Lorenzo

Hello Seniors!

To prepare for the upcoming school year and begin developing your critical reading and analytical writing skills, you are required to read *one* of the following literary works over the summer:

- **Frankenstein** by Mary Shelley
- **Dracula** by Bram Stoker
- **Brave New World** by Aldous Huxley

### Your Task:

Choose **one** of the three novels listed above to read in its entirety **before the first day of school**. This reading will serve as the foundation for discussion and an extra credit project in the first weeks of class.

### Annotation Requirement:

As you read, you must **annotate directly in the margins of the book** or on sticky notes if you are using a borrowed or digital copy. Your annotations will be **checked for credit** during the first week of school.

### What to Annotate:

To guide your reading and ensure thoughtful engagement, mark and comment on the following:

- **Key Themes** – What central ideas or questions does the novel explore?
- **Character Development** – Track major characters and how they evolve.
- **Important Passages** – Underline or highlight meaningful quotes. Why are they significant?
- **Literary Devices** – Note examples of symbolism, imagery, irony, foreshadowing, etc.
- **Personal Reactions & Questions** – What confuses you? What do you agree or disagree with? What connections can you make to modern society or your own experiences?

Your annotations should show that you are reading actively, thinking critically, and engaging with the text on a deeper level.

**What You'll Be Graded On:**

- Completion of the reading
- Quality and depth of annotations
- Evidence of engagement with the novel's ideas
