### ART 100 INTRODUCTION TO VISUAL ARTS — 3 CREDITS SATURDAYS 9:00AM—12:20PM

A selective examination of the materials and forms of the visual arts -- including painting, sculpture, and architecture -- designed to provide students with a critical and historical framework for evaluating visual experience. The course will combine slide lectures and films with a number of museum and gallery visits.

**Prerequisite:** A grade of **75** or higher on the ELA Regents *or* a **480** SAT Verbal *or* **20** ACT English *or* **27** PSAT – Reading Portion

### COR 100 US ISSUES, IDEAS & INSTITUTIONS — 3 CREDIT SATURDAYS 10:10AM—1:15PM

COR 100 is a required general education course that introduces CSI students to contemporary America's constitutional democracy, multiracial society, and market economy, using the tools of the social sciences. The course seeks historical perspective by examining three formative periods in U.S. history: the American Revolution and debate over the Constitution, the African American freedom struggle from slavery through the civil rights movement, and the evolving relationship between government regulation and the market economy during the 20th century. The course is writing intensive and is intended to develop logical, critical thought and expression.

**Prerequisite:** A grade of **75** or higher on the ELA Regents *or* a **480** SAT Verbal *or* **20** ACT English *or* **27** PSAT – Reading Portion

### ECO 101 INTRODUCTION TO ECONOMICS - 3 CREDITS SATURDAYS 9:00AM-11:30AM

This course examines the principles of economics in the context of the operation of the United States economy. Both microeconomic theory (behavior of firms and households) and macroeconomic theory (total output, inflation, employment and unemployment, economic growth) will be introduced as will economic approaches to social problems.

**Prerequisite:** There are *two* prerequisites for this course:

- 1. A grade of **70** or higher on the Common Core Algebra or Geometry Regents **or 65** or higher on the Alg2/Trig Regents, **or 500** SAT Math, **or 21** on the ACT.
- 2. Students must be on track to successfully complete a third year of math at the time of registration, if they have not already done so.
- \* Students who have taken the older Integrated Algebra, Geometry, or Alg2/Trig Regents need an 80 or higher, instead of 70 or higher.

### FNC 111 PERSONAL FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT — 3 CREDITS SATURDAYS 9:00AM—11:30AM

Discussion of the problems involved in handling personal financial matters: Topics will include managing credit and money, financial planning, asset allocation, taxes, life insurance, investments and securities, annuities, wills, trusts, retirement and estate planning, and budgeting

**Prerequisite:** There are *two* prerequisites for this course:

- 1. A grade of **75** or higher on the ELA Regents *or* a **480** SAT Verbal *or* **20** ACT English *or* **27** PSAT –Reading Portion
- 2. A grade of **70** or higher on the Common Core Algebra Regents

### PSY 100 PSYCHOLOGY - 3 CREDITS SATURDAYS 9:00AM-11:30AM

A study of the important facts and theories concerning human behavior and its motivation. Included will be: research methodology; at least three topics from learning, cognition, testing, physiology, and phenomenology; and at least three topics from personality, psychopathology, emotion and motivation, history and systems, development, and social factors. Topics will be related to major trends in recent cultural history and to current social and moral issues.

**Prerequisite:** A grade of **75** or higher on the ELA Regents *or* a **480** SAT Verbal *or* **20** ACT English *or* **27** PSAT – Reading Portion

### SOC 100 SOCIOLOGY - 3 CREDITS SATURDAYS 9:00AM-11:30AM

A study of modern society with emphasis on such fundamental groupings as the family, class, the community, the state, the interaction between cultures and the individual, and the processes by which institutions come into being and develop, and important social theories.

**Prerequisite:** A grade of **75** or higher on the ELA Regents *or* a **480** SAT Verbal *or* **20** ACT English *or* **27** PSAT – Reading Portion

### **Information to Complete Immunization Requirements**

### Measles, Mumps, Rubella:

New York State Public Health Law 2165 requires all students entering a post-secondary institution to provide their health services center with proof of immunity to measles, mumps and rubella. This law applies to students born on or after January 1, 1957, who are registered for 6 or more credits (or its equivalent) regardless of degree or non-degree status at a CUNY campus.

### ACCEPTABLE PROOF OF IMMUNITY MAY INCLUDE:

- (1) Immunization cards from childhood (yellow card), signed and stamped.
- (2) Immunization records from college, high school or other schools you attended.
- (3) Signed and stamped immunization record from your health care provider, clinic or immunization records obtained from a public health department immunization information system. Students born after 1994 who were raised in New York City can check the Citywide Immunization Registry for their records by calling the College Health Services or 311.
- (4) Copy of lab report, (also known as titer or serology), showing immunity to measles, mumps and rubella.
- (5) Proof of honorable discharge from the armed services within 10 years from the date of application will enable the student to attend school pending actual receipt of the immunization records from the armed services.
