Our New York State ELA Assessment is scheduled for Wednesday, April 11, 2018 and Thursday, April 12, 2018. I encourage all students to get a good night sleep prior to test days, enjoy a healthy breakfast and come to school with sharpened number two pencils. **Also, don't forget to wear your glasses, if needed,** and RELAX. As our T-shirts say, KEEP CALM AND PANTHER ON!! Your child's schedule will change slightly during testing days. On exam days (stated above) they will report to their official class teacher for period 1. They will be dismissed from that room at the conclusion of their testing. They will then proceed to regularly scheduled classes.

The New York State Math Assessment is scheduled for Tuesday, May 1, 2018 and Wednesday, May 2, 2018.

The end of the third marking period is **April 12, 2018.**

I am very pleased with the number of students who chose to become members of our National Junior Honor Society. Students will be notified of their acceptance on April 20, 2018. Our ceremony will be held in May. The date will be forthcoming.

Preparations for end of year ceremonies and celebrations are well underway. The eighth grade end of year letter outlining dates and costs is attached to this newsletter. Along with the 8th grade end of year letter is a behavior contract. This contract will be reviewed with your child at school. What topics will the students learn this month?



ELA – We are in the home stretch in our preparations for the NY State ELA exam! The students will be reading the novel *Maniac Magee* by Jerry Spinelli. They will also continue to expand their vocabulary skills through Wordly Wise activities.

Math – This month the students will convert customary units of length, capacity and weight. They will convert metric units of length, capacity and mass, create and understand line plots and classify plane figures. The students will also continue to prepare for the NY State Math exam.

Science – We "travel around the globe" exploring the different environments that exist on our planet and learn how plants and animals adapt to live and thrive in each one. We continue to do our investigations and labs to reinforce our hands-on learning. The students will begin soil preparation and plantings for our in-class garden.

Social Studies – In April the students will examine how specific individuals, documents, battles and geography shaped the outcome of the American Revolution. They will work to complete an in class packet that includes tasks such identifying the cause and effects the British taxation had on the American Colonies, analyzing political cartoons, identifying different viewpoints leading up to the war and answering text dependent questions based on primary and secondary sources.

Social Studies - Students will work with a variety of primary and secondary sources as well as reading "George vs. George the American Revolution as seen from Both Sides" by Rosalyn Schanzer
