What topics will the students learn today?



ELA – The students will continue to read *Esperanza Rising* by p[am Munoz Ryan and paired non-fiction passages/articles focusing on social issues. During writing workshop, the students will begin to write explanatory/informative pieces.

Math – The students will multiply decimals by 10, 100 or 1,000; estimate the product of a decimal and a whole number. They will multiply money, multiply two decimals and solve multi-step problems. The students will then begin dividing decimals.

Science – This month the students will continue their hands-on learning of VARIABLES. We will explore flight, aviation and airplane basics as a vehicle of study to strengthen our understanding of how independent, dependent and controlled variables relate. December is our month to SOAR into SCIENCE!

Social Studies - During the month of December the students will continue to examine the impact Hudson's exploration had on history.
