What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – During this month students will continue reading, "Esperanza Rising," by Pam Munoz Ryan. We will begin our nonfiction writing pieces tying in our "Historical Notes" and new found knowledge gained throughout the novel. Student will use research tools to learn more about the historical time period that takes place during "Esperanza Rising".

Math – Students will use division patterns with decimals, divide decimals by whole numbers, estimate quotients, divide decimals by decimals, write zeros in the dividend, and problem solve using decimal operations. Students will also use variables to write expressions, use order of operations, simplify expressions, evaluate expressions, and extend tables by identifying patterns.

Science – Our 5th Grade Science students will be continuing their "variable investigations" through their experimentation with buoyancy and airplane basics. Students will be increasing their academic vocabulary along the way and will begin to analyze collected data with the intention of finding relationships that exist between independent and dependent variables. These relationships will be used to predict the outcome of future controlled experiments that are designed and conducted by the students. Our variable investigations will continue next month as we "fly" into Airplane Basics and create a timeline of aviation history.

Social Studies – During the month of December the students will examine what motivated European explorers to explore the western hemisphere. They will also identify the difficulties Columbus faced during his first voyage using a primary source.

Students are permitted to use their own notes and science folders during our Science tests, and students are urged every day to maintain their notes with competence and confidence to assure they have valuable resources filled with relevant information.

Social Studies packets will be completed and graded in class.



Required Reading

ELA - *Esperanza Rising* by Pam Munoz Ryan; Various non-fiction articles

Math – Go Math Ch. 5; Pearson Topic 7 & 8 Science – Students are reading the works and scientific findings of Sir Isaac Newton, Galileo Galilei, and Archimedes to understand the concepts surrounding laws of gravity and motion, pendulums, and how to use the displacement of water to find the density of an object.

Come to Math class prepared with your math notebook, folder (with packets inside) and pencil daily and ready to learn. Math Winter Break packet due January 4th

Students are responsible for maintaining organized and complete Science notes and lab books to assure that they have accurate resources for the topics that we are exploring. Random notebook checks are conducted routinely. Students are welcome to come up to my room during their lunch period for my assistance in helping them with note taking and organization.

Parents will be invited to JOIN us in our Science Classroom on **Monday, December 10th** for a "**Parents as Partners**" workshop in which our science sleuths will collect and analyze the different types of fingerprints that we have among our group.
