### What topics will the students learn today?

ELA - In December, we will begin our second novel, Esperanza Rising by Pam Munoz Ryan. We will be focusing on the genre of historical fiction. Students will be studying the historical time period in which the story takes place. Students will be working in a writing workshop to publish non-fiction pieces.

Math – Students will continue to multiply decimal fractions, convert units of measure when solving multi-steps problems, divide with whole numbers and decimal fractions with multi-step problems. We will begin Module 3-Equivalent fractions, add and subtract fractions.

Science – Variables! Variables! Variables! Students are learning how to identify and analyze the relationship between independent and dependent variables within a controlled experiment. Together they will record data and begin to recognize how the independent variable (x) affects the dependent variable (y) and be able to show that relationship in different graphs.

Social Studies - Students will identify and define the main characteristics of the Paleolithic Era and Neolithic Era and then be able to describe the Neolithic Revolution as a pivotal turning point in human history. Students will analyze and explain the effects of the Neolithic Revolution on the human race.
