What topics will the students learn this month?



ELA – The students will be completing the novel *Esperanza Rising* by Pam Munoz Ryan. We will continue to study the historical aspects of the novel while becoming nonfiction readers and writers.

Math – This month the students will learn addition and subtraction of fractions and mixed numbers with unlike denominators. They will then begin to multiply and divide with fractions.

Science – During the month of February we will expand our study of environmental science and ecosystems, and will turn our focus on the land forms and elements of Earth. We will continue practicing working through the steps of the Scientific Method in our investigations and labs.

Social Studies – The students will examine the formation and geography of the 13 American colonies. The students will then identify the causes of the American Revolution by examining a variety of primary and secondary sources. Participating in our Social Studies Fair this month is optional. Students who choose to participate may work in groups of 2-3 and pick any person, place or event from American or World History that relates to the theme "Power, Race, or Gender". Topics must be approved by the Social Studies teacher. Projects are due March 1st and will be presented at the Social Studies Fair on March 9th.
