# What topics will the students learn this month?



ELA – The students will continue reading the novel Maniac Magee by Jerry Spinelli. We will focus on the skill of comparing and contrasting not only within this novel but across the fiction genre. The students will revisit the novels we read throughout the year. The students will also be working on writing an argumentative piece.

Math – After the state exam the students will name a point on a coordinate grid, find distances on a coordinate grid and use a coordinate grid to solve problems. Next the students will begin the chapter on Getting Ready for 6<sup>th</sup> Grade.

Science – It's SCIENCE FAIR EXPOSITION month!! Science fair projects and TRIFOLD BOARDS are required from EACH student and carry a great deal of weight for the 4<sup>th</sup> marking period report cards in Science. In class we are breaking up into 5 different ecosystems and becoming EXPERTS in them. Students work cooperatively in their table group community to complete 6 different tasks such as creating a world map highlighting their ecosystem or creating a 3D sculpture of biotic elements of their ecosystem to be hung in our room. Simultaneously, students tend to the daily care and maintenance of their planted garden that includes lettuce, tomatoes, peas and other edibles. Spring has sprung in Science!

Social Studies - Students will examine how the end of the American Revolution led to the formation of the American government. Students will work to complete an in class packet that includes tasks such as identifying the basic formation of the American Government as well as the function of each part of our government. They will continue to analyze political cartoons, identify different viewpoints and answer text dependent questions based on primary and secondary sources.
