# What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – We will continue our study on the non-fiction genre of biography. We will be using different research tools to learn about people who have significantly shaped our world. Students will then use this research to teach others and formulate theories. During writing workshop, we will be writing autobiographies.

Math – After the NY State Math exam the students will name a point on a coordinate grid, find distances on a coordinate grid, and use a coordinate grid to solve problems.

Science – Fifth grade students will be learning about the human body as a group of systems that work in unison and balance together. Students will learn about nutrition and how we rely on different parts of plants for nutrients. The students will use their investigative and research skills to gain a deeper understanding of the magnificent machine - their own bodies!

Social Studies - This month the students will continue to examine how the natural geography of America led to the development of the thirteen colonies. Students will be able to identify characteristics of the 3 colonial regions, as well as compare and contrast the colonial regions.
