What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – During the month of November the students will begin reading the novel "Esperanza Rising," by Pam Munoz Ryan. We will be focusing on the genre of historical fiction. Students will be studying the historical time period in which the story takes place.

Math – This month the students will divide by 1 and 2-digit divisors, understand division with partial quotients, estimate the quotient for reasonableness, interpret remainders, divide by multiples of 10, adjust quotients and connect models and symbols. The students will also multiply decimals and whole numbers, multiply decimals and decimals, use expanded form, multiply money, and multiply with zeros in the product.

Science – We have begun our "Variables Unit" in which we learn to identify and work with Independent Variables, Dependent Variables, and Constant Conditions within Controlled Experiments. We will use an exploration of and experimentation with **pendulums** as a springboard into this unit of study. Students will work in their Table Groups on labs to support their hypothesis about relationships that could exist between Independent and Dependent Variables. Students are practicing their **organizational skills** throughout this unit, starting with their note taking! The need for careful organization becomes more and more important as we venture into data collection during our experimentations.

Social Studies – During this month the students will examine the impact the Columbia Exchange had on both the Old and New World using a variety of sources. They will also practice answering text dependent questions on the topic.

Science - Students will have **Notebook Checks** every couple of weeks to ensure that they have complete and meaningful notes in their books that they can use as resource tools to enhance their own learning. Test and Quiz grades will be announced.

Science – Students will be reading about the scientific works and explorations of different scientists including Sir Isaac Newton and Jane Goodall to help them gain a real world reference to how science has shaped our modern world, and how the scientists behind the advancements have attained their findings. The teacher provides all reading information in class to the students.
