I am happy to see so many families supporting our school uniform policy. As per our school uniform policy, <u>ALL</u> students are required to wear uniforms every day to school. The uniform policy consists of a light blue top with navy blue bottoms, a school physical education uniform, or school spirit wear. I will continue to have incentives for students in compliance with the uniform policy. I will also continue to use the "*Citywide Standards of Intervention and Discipline Measures*" if a student is not in compliance. The infraction code is B02 – "Failing to wear the required school uniform (applies only to students in grades 6 - 12 in schools that have adopted a school uniform policy and whose parents have not secured an exemption.) Students not in compliance with the school uniform policy will receive a warning letter as a courtesy.

Petrides PAWS Points Tracker sheets were explained and distributed to all middle school students. Students can earn points for PAWS behavior throughout the month. Our reward token store will be open during the first week of November.

Our PAL after school program is well underway. I am excited to see so many students in attendance! In order for students to participate in our free after school program, they must complete a PAL application. Applications are available online at petridesschool.com or in my office. The program runs from 2:30 to 6:00 daily and students can attend only part time if desired.

What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – During the month of October we will continue reading the novel "The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane" by Kate Dicamillo. The students will focus on character analysis by citing textual evidence using the skill of inferences. Please see the corresponding packet. The students are working in groups and independently. They will begin working on a narrative in a writer's workshop.

Math – This month the students will add and subtract whole numbers and decimals and estimate sums and differences of decimals. The students will review properties of multiple and multiply multi-digit numbers.

Science – Our fifth grade students continue to dive into Intertidal Zones learning about the interdependence between plants and animals in this unique ecosystem. The students begin to learn The Scientific Method as a PROCESS of steps carefully taken when experimenting.

Social Studies – Students will be examining the 5 themes of geography to determine how geography influences the development of a country or region.

As per our uniform policy **ALL** students are required to wear uniforms every day to school. The uniform policy consists of a light blue collared shirt and dark blue bottoms.


Please come prepared to class daily with math folder, notebook and sharpened pencils. Use online resources <u>www.pearsonsuccessnet.com</u>.
