Socialization is paramount in the life of an adolescent. Sociologists have noted its importance for a long time. "In order to build gratifying human relationships, it is vital that children learn and have the opportunity to practice social skills considered appropriate." We are happily planning some social activities to celebrate Halloween in middle school! On Thursday, October 31, 2019 we will be having a Middle School Halloween Party. This event will be held on the athletic field from 1:00 - 2:15pm. We will have DJ entertainment, candy, prizes and blow up rides for students. The cost will be \$10 per student. A permission slip will be forthcoming. I am happy to see so many families supporting our school uniform policy.

As per our school uniform policy, ALL students are required to wear uniforms every day to school. The uniform policy consists of a light blue top with navy blue bottoms, a school physical education uniform, or school spirit wear. I will continue to have incentives for students in compliance with the uniform policy. I will also continue to use the "Citywide Standards of Intervention and Discipline Measures" if a student is not in compliance. The infraction code is B02 – "Failing to wear the required school uniform (applies only to students in grades 6 - 12 in schools that have adopted a school uniform policy and whose parents have not secured an exemption.) Students not in compliance with the school uniform policy will receive a warning letter as a courtesy.

Petrides PAWS Points Tracker sheets were explained and distributed to all middle school students. Students can earn points for PAWS behavior throughout the month. Our reward token store will be open during the first week of November. We have also implemented an ATTENDANCE INCENTIVE where official classes can earn paws points for 100% attendance daily.

Our PAL after school program is well underway. I am excited to see so many students in attendance! In order for students to participate in our free after school program, they must complete a PAL application. Applications are available online at petridesschool.com or in my office. The program runs from 2:30 to 6:00 daily and students can attend only part time if desired.

What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – Students will be reading the novel, "The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane," by Kate DiCamillo. Our learning intentions for the month will focus on quoting accurately from a text to support our thinking and make inferences. We will study characters to determine how they change over time. Students will become experts at utilizing the skill of comparing and contrasting. Students will work in a writer's workshop to publish narratives.

Math – This month the students will be adding and subtracting decimals, estimating sums and differences, and solving multi-step problems. They will then begin multiplication with whole numbers and decimals.

Science – We are on our way as OBSERVANT young scientists and this month we will be applying our abilities to closely examine and research how and why things happen to the INTERTIDAL ZONES of our coastal areas. Students will engage in hands-on and minds-on investigations throughout our unit.

Social Studies - Students will be examining the five themes of geography to determine how geography influences the development of a country or region.
