ELA – During the month of February the students will finish reading *Wonder* by R.J. Palacio while continuing to explore the various themes of the book such as kindness and courage.

Math – This month the Sixth graders will cover topics 7 through 9 where we will add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions. The fifth graders skills covered will be topics 7 dividing decimals and topics 8: Numerical Expressions and Patterns.

Science – Students will discuss how clouds form and are classified and describe how rain, hail, sleet and snow develop. The students will discuss the dangers of severe weather.
