What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – During the month of January we will continue reading *Wonder* by R.J. Palacio while exploring theme throughout the book.

Math – As the New Year begins we will continue to focus on number sense in both grade levels. Our fifth graders will continue to practice multiplication and division as they learn more about using these operations with decimals. In sixth grade, we will focus this month on operations with fractions.

Science – During January the students will explain how solar heating and water vapor in the atmosphere affect weather. They will discuss how clouds form and how they are classified and describe how rain, hail, sleet and snow develop. The students will also explain how tornadoes develop from thunderstorms and the dangers of severe weather.

Social Studies – This month we will finish learning about Henry Hudson and his contributions to our area. The students will write an opinion piece on how they feel Henry Hudson should be remembered.
