
What topics will the students learn this month?

ELA – During our last month of the 2017-2018 school year the students will write an argumentative/opinion writing piece to support claims/ a point of view with reasons and relevant evidence and information.

Math – For the month of June, we will finish up our unit on the coordinate system and spend the month reviewing all the concepts covered this year.

Science – Student swill identify different species of sharks. They will conduct research distinguishing among facts. They will recognize what role sharks play in their ecosystem and the importance of shark conservation. Student will also cite textual evidence to support their analysis/claim if the Megladon shark still exists. They will also compare and contrast information gained from experiments and videos with that gained from reading a text on the same topic.

Social Studies – In June we will continue to explore our nation's growth and finish our unit with a study of the Civil War.
