## What topics will the students learn today?

ELA –In April, after much hard work & practice, we will be taking our Statewide ELA exam. We have learned skills and strategies to do our best and show what we know! We will also be officially launching our unit on Understanding Perspectives. We will research articles & various texts to examine and understand multiple perspectives surrounding an event. Students will learn to use all available resources to research and write their own informational article in a newspaper format.

Math – Sixth graders will be working on a review of the following topics: expressions and equations, geometry, the number system, ratios and proportional relationships.

Science – Students will define science and identify questions that science cannot answer. Students will compare and contrast theories and law. Students will identify the three main branches of science. They will define hypothesis and recognize how the scientific method is applied. They will also identify the difference between observation and inferences.

Social Studies – Students will identify how geography presented both opportunities and obstacles that helped shaped the development of the Golden Age of Greece.
