What topics will the students learn today?

ELA - Students will enrich their understanding of our central texts and support their analysis of theme by viewing of the films Wonder & Lightning Thief – 6.RL.7: I Can Compare and Contrast the experience of reading a text with seeing and hearing the performance of a text. We will also launch our December unit with a close look at Rules to Live By. Our guiding question will be "How do people formulate and use rules to improve their lives and communicate these ideas to others?" We will dive into rich texts and research to explore this topic.

Math – Students will be working on expressions and equation from chapter 2 and 4 throughout this month. Students will be able to extend previous understandings of arithmetic to algebraic expressions.

Science – This month the students will identify gases in earth's atmosphere and describe the structure of earth's atmosphere. Students will recognize the importance of the earth's atmosphere and how the layers impact life on earth. They will also describe what happens to the energy earth receives from the sun, comparing and contrasting radiation, conduction and convention.

Social Studies – During the month of December the students will use their knowledge of the characteristics of civilization to identify the achievement and contributions of the early river civilizations. This will include a focus on ancient Mesopotamia and Egypt.
