## What topics will the students learn today?



ELA – Students will continue to examine their focus standard 6.RL.9 and compare/contrast how texts in different genres approach a theme. The students will become writers as researchers and craft an essay to inform about a self-chosen "Rule to Live By". The students will substantiate their claim with text based evidence and relevant details.

Math – Students will begin studying Chapter 11. The students will learn the mathematical terms associated with lines and angles, as well as two-dimensional figures. The following terms will all be encountered in this topic and are included in the vocabulary cards.

Science – The students in Class 620 & 621 will learn about biotic and abiotic factors in environments. This unit includes how climate influences life in an ecosystem, the nitrogen and carbon cycle, how energy flows through an ecosystem, the different levels of energy in a food chain and how organisms that live in pairs of the ocean where sunlight does not reach use chemosynthesis to produce their own energy rich molecules. This month the students in class 622 will identify how thermal energy and water vapor affect weather. They will discuss cloud formation and classification. The students will also discuss the dangers of severe weather and identify the symbols used in weather maps and forecasts.

Social Studies – During the month of February the students will learn all about the Dark Ages, Feudalism and life on the Manor.
