## What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – Students will continue to analyze text structures, themes across literature, and think deeply and critically about text. They will continue to analyze literary, real life and poetic examples of Rules to Live By. Students will also share their informational essays on self-chosen topics and provide feedback. They will substantiate their claim with text based evidence and relevant details. Students will extend their research and incorporate technology to create power point projects as a visual representation of their research studies. Students will additionally be immersed in rich texts, articles, and prior exemplars in preparation for the upcoming statewide ELA exam.

Math – Students will be working on geometry (chapters 11, 17 & 18 in Pearson). They will be working on two and threedimensional objects, with or without curved surfaces, that can be described, classified, and analyzed by their attributes. An object's location in space can be described quantitatively.

Science – Students will explain how solar heating and water vapor in the atmosphere affect weather. They will discuss how clouds formulate and how they are classified into the following groups: stratus, cumulous, and cirrus. They will recognize and describe how rain, hail, sleet and snow develop. Students will also describe how weather is associated with fronts and high and low pressure areas.

Social Studies – Student will examine what role belief systems played in a variety of societies and identify the impact these beliefs had on the Eastern Hemisphere.
