# What topics will the students learn today?



ELA – This month the students will begin their unit on working with evidence. The students will research to write an essay to inform about an important self-chosen Rule to Live By, supported with facts, definitions, concrete details, quotations and examples. The students will look at literary, poetic and real-life examples to inspire their writing.

Math – The students will be able to write, read and evaluate expressions in which a letter stands for numbers. They will also be able to represent and analyze quantitative relationships between dependent and independent variables.

Science – The students in class 620 will explain how solar heating and water vapor in the atmosphere affect weather. They will also discuss how clouds form and how they are classified. Then the students will describe how rain, hail, sleet and snow develop. The students in Class 621 & 622 will finish their unit on Weather. They will transition from Earth Science to Life Science and begin to learn how a population consists of individuals of a species that are found together at a given place and time. These populations form a community. The community and the physical factors with which it interacts compose an ecosystem.

Social Studies – During the month of January the students will be learning all about Rome and The Roman Empire. There will be a Data Based Question (DBQ) exam on this topic later in the month.
