What topics will the students learn today?

ELA - In our next unit, Working with Evidence, students will focus on the following Guiding Questions & Learning Objectives: What are Rules to Live By? How do people formulate these rules to lead better lives? These Rules to Live By are communicated through multiple literary models. We have just completed our literary model – *Bud, Not Buddy*. We will continue looking at inspiration though poetic and real life examples. We will then research to write an Essay to Inform about a self-chosen rule to live by, supported with facts, definitions, details & examples. This research project will cycle through the writing process and include references.

Math – Students will be working on ratios and proportional relationships from chapter on 13, 14 and 16 throughout this month. Students will be connecting ratio and rate to whole number multiplication and division and using concepts of ratio and rate to solve problems.

Science – Students will continue to explore the atmosphere and its significance in order to sustain life on planet earth. Students will describe what happens to energy Earth receives from the sun, comparing and contrasting radiation, conduction, and convection Students will partake in lab exploring conduction through various materials. . Students will also explain how the water cycles and its effect on weather patterns and climate.

Social Studies – Students will continue using their knowledge of the characteristics of civilization to identify the achievement and contributions of the early river civilizations. They will finish studying ancient Mesopotamia and move on to Egypt.
