What topics will the students learn today?



ELA – Our next unit will encompass an emphasis on building and strengthening skills for the upcoming statewide ELA exam. Students will practice identified skills via our iReady Diagnostic Assessment and take part in interactive tutorials via our iReady toolkit program. We will also learn multiple strategies for constructing 2 point short responses and demystifying multiple choice. Students will additionally learn how to formulate a 4-point essay, all according to the NYS Evaluation Rubric. Students will begin our unit on Understanding Perspectives and begin our Novel Dragonwings. We will examine multiple perspectives on the same event to understand how diverse points of view help us live in an increasingly changing society.

Math – This month the students will be reviewing all sixth grade topics: the number system, ratios & proportional relationships, expressions & equation, geometry.

Science – Students will explain how tornadoes develop from thunderstorms and discuss the dangers of severe weather. Students will explain how data is collected for weather maps and forecasts and identify symbols used in weather maps. Students will begin researching a historic hurricane or tornado for a news segment group presentation to be presented the second week in April. Detailed assignment and guidelines will be handed out in class.

Social Studies – Students will continue to examine the role belief systems played in a variety of societies and identify the impact these beliefs had on the Eastern Hemisphere. The Unit will focus on Hinduism, Judaism, Buddhism, Christianity and Islam.
