What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – In the month of May, we will continue to research as writers. Students will gather documentation surrounding the 1906 Earthquake & Fire – which is a historical event highlighted in our focus novel *Dragonwings*. We will investigate multiple perspectives surrounding the same event & shape our point of view using interviews, data & facts. Students will craft their own journalistic article in a newspaper format based on research. We will support our historical fiction novel with non-fiction supplemental texts. We will focus on learning standards 6.RI.6 – Point of View and 6.W.8 – Assessing source documentation and credibility/quoting data.

Math – Sixth graders will be working on statistics and probability. Students will be answering questions by collecting and analyzing data that needs to be collected and how best to collect it. Data can be represented visually using tables, charts, and graphs. The type of data determines the best choice of visual representation.

Science – Students will identify places where life is found on earth. Students will define ecology. Students will observe how the environment influences life and list factors that influence changes in population size. They will also describe how organisms obtain energy for life. Students will then identify how organisms interact and will recognize that every organism occupies a niche.

Social Studies – This month the students will identify the characteristics and contributions of the Golden Age of Greece, as well as compare and contrast the Greek city-states of Athens and Sparta.
