What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – In November, students will continue reading *Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief* by Rick Riordan. One of the main focuses throughout the novel is heroism. More specifically, what actually makes a hero? Other than Percy having mythological powers, he conveys heroic qualities in a more humanistic way throughout the novel. For this narrative, we will analyze Percy's grounded heroic qualities, as well as the character traits for the supporting characters (Grover, Sally and Gabe). Throughout the novel we will reinforce literary elements discussed prior in class, such as theme, conflict, and different types of literary characters.

Math – Sixth graders will be working on writing, interpreting, and using expressions and equations.

Science – Students will continue to learn about states of matter. They will investigate how the phases in which matter exists depends on the attractive forces among it's particles and how the motion of particles helps to explain the phase of matter, as well as the changes from one phase to another. They will examine examples of physical changes of state and identify how these changes occur when thermal energy is either absorbed or released.

Social Studies - Students will identify the differences between a primary and secondary source. Students will then examine how archaeology helps shape our understanding of prehistoric humans and early man.
