The New York State Math Assessment is scheduled for Tuesday, May 1, 2018 and Wednesday, May 2, 2018.

The end of the third marking period is April 12, 2018.

I am very pleased with the number of students who chose to become members of our National Junior Honor Society. Students will be notified of their acceptance on April 20, 2018. Our ceremony will be held in May. The date will be forthcoming.

Preparations for end of year ceremonies and celebrations are well underway. The eighth grade end of year letter outlining dates and costs is attached to this newsletter. What topics will the students learn this month?

ELA –In the first half of April, the students will continue preparing for the NY State ELA exam by reviewing skills and strategies. We will begin our research paper following the state exam. The students will learn how to gather information, site sources using MLA format and organize ideas to form coherent expository writing pieces. Soon we will begin our fourth and final novel, *Speak* by Laurie Halse Anderson

Math – During the month of April the students will review all the skill learned this year in preparation for the upcoming NY State Math exam on May 1^{st} and 2^{nd}

Science – In April the students will continue to learn about cells and the organelles that make up the cells. They will learn about parts of the microscope and how to properly use a compound microscope to look at specimens.

Social Studies – This month our Social Studies Scholars will continue studying the expansion of our country during the 1800s as well as the ideology of Manifest Destiny. Topics will include Jacksonian Democracy, Mexican American War, Industrial Technology, Gold Rush, Trail of Tear, Great Awakening and Women's Rights Movement. Our unit will conclude with students designing their own websites, books, or news segments based on an event or topic specific to the westward expansion era.
