What topics will the students learn this month?

ELA – In December we will study character development and the importance of setting in *A Long Walk to Water* by Linda Sue Park. Non-fiction articles about Southern Sudan will accompany the novel. The students will gather evidence about the theme of survival in the text.

Math – This month the students will solve real-life and mathematical problems using numerical and algebraic expressions and equations.

Science – For the month of December the students will begin their journey into the past and begin looking at what life was like long ago. The students will learn about the conditions necessary for fossils to form and how fossils can be used to explain changes in life forms, Earth's surface and the environment.

Social Studies – During the month of December our Social Studies Scholars will be exploring Unit 2-The Road to Independence. They will investigate the French and Indian War, Colonial Response to Taxation, Cause and Effects of the Revolution, and Declaration of Independence.
