What topics will the students learn today?



ELA – In December, we will begin our second novel, A Long Walk to Water, by Linda Sue Park. Our focus for this unit is on the effect of setting on character. Students will gather and analyze evidence about the influence of culture, time and place on the protagonists in the novel. This work will prepare them for our third major writing piece, the response to literature.

Math – This month the students will solve real-life and mathematical problems using numerical and algebraic expressions and equations.

Science – We are SCIENCE CITIZENS! Students are being driven by their own high interest topic to build a deeper understanding of the science in the world around them. Together we recognize how human impact shapes and impacts the natural community that we are a part of and we begin to expand our knowledge to other world biomes. Students use the cycles of energy (nitrogen, carbon, etc.) as a gauge to determine the balance and health of each biome.

Social Studies -This month our Social Studies Scholars will be exploring Unit 2, The Road to Independence and will investigate the French and Indian War, Colonial Response to Taxation, Cause/Effects of the Revolution, key battles of the war, and Declaration of Independence. This will lead to our study of "Hamilton, An American Musical" connected to the people, events, and ideas of the time.


