What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – In ELA, we will embark on our third novel study using Julius Lester's Day of Tears. This is a book about the people who were affected by the largest slave auction in American history. Students will continue annotation strategies that lead to an in-depth understanding of the text. We will examine the impact of word choice and figurative language on mood. Supplemental readings about slavery will be used to provide historical context for the novel.

Math – This month students will use measures of center and measures of variability for numerical data from random samples to draw informal comparative inferences about two populations.

Science – Students take their knowledge of ecology to a microscope level as we begin our unit on CELLS. Students will differentiate between plant and animal cells and begin to understand how cells repair, reproduce, and work together in systems accomplishing specific tasks.

Social Studies - This month our Social Studies Scholars will be exploring the ratification of the Constitution and formation of a new American government and nation. We will also be unraveling Hamilton's economic plan, the presidencies of George Washington, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, and Louisiana Purchase. The unit will conclude with a performance-based assessment with students investigating why people create, structure, and change governments.
