What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – In June we will continue reading Day of Tears by Julius Lester and exploring the impact of slavery on individuals and society. Students will be reading self-selected texts about the slave experience and completing five weekly responses based on their reading. Also, students will continue reading and annotating books and articles to gather information for their research reports. We will work on all stages of the writing process, including drafting, revising and publishing in order to create a final report. Students will have the opportunity to present their research at the end of June.

Math - Students will learn to find the distance and midpoint of a line. They will apply their knowledge of slope, midpoint and distance to complete their in-class project.

Science – Students will delve into the Body Systems that they are comprised of and they will observe how these systems work collectively to ensure a safe and healthy body exists. Students gain understanding of nutrition, hygiene and healthy habits that encourage a positive adolescence.

Social Studies - This month our Social Studies Scholars will be diving into Unit 5, A Nation Divided, by analyzing the causes/effects of the Civil War, major battles throughout the war and resulting Constitutional amendments. Students will continue their study of United States History in Grade 8 starting with Reconstruction directly following the Civil War. We will also be concluding this year with an abbreviated mock Multiple Choice Regents Exam culmination of the content studied this year. It has been a pleasure teaching your children in Social Studies class. Have a wonderful summer!
