What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – In May, we will continue reading *Day of Tears* and exploring the historical context. To accompany the novel we will read non-fiction articles, including primary sources, about slavery and its effects on individuals and society. Students will be able to compare and contrast the novel and various historical accounts of the same period in order to understand how authors of fiction use or alter history in their writing.

Math – Students will learn to solve and graph linear equations with one variable. They will learn how to find and graph the slope of a line.

Science – Students will be learning about the different systems that make up the human body and how these systems interact and impact one another. Wellness, nutrition, growth and development will be explored through research, discussion and questioning. The students will be introduced to cells and genetics, as well.

Social Studies – This month our Social Studies Scholars will be completing their study of Unit 4: A Nation Grows, Expansion and Reform 1800-1860 with a study of Andrew Jackson, the Mexican American War, Industrial Revolution, Erie Canal, Gold Rush, Irish Potato Famine, and Declaration of Sentiments. We will begin Unit 5: A Nation Divided that will take us through the growth of slavery, abolition movement, and causes/effects of the Civil War.
