What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – In November, students will learn how to analyze the development of themes over the course of a text. They will choose one central idea in Monster and write a thematic essay using textual evidence to support their analysis of the theme. After moving through all of the steps in the writing process, students will eventually peer assess, self-assess and publish their essays.

Math – This month the students will learn to analyze proportional relationships and use them to solve real-world and mathematical problems.

Science – We have begun our "Focus Groups" in Science and will be working in our groups to become experts on designated Environmental Issues that presently concern us globally and locally. Students will work together to research their topics, to gather relevant data, to collect evidence to support their ideas/claims regarding the issue. The groups will present their published data, written research, and their informational posters to the rest of the class to teach that content to them. Through peer teaching, students elevate their understanding of how human actions impact the natural world around them.

Social Studies – This month our Social Studies Scholars will be concluding their Unit 1 study with their first Regents based test, which will consist of multiple choice and thematic essays. We will also be working on a document-based informational writing task focused on the themes of wealth, power, and morality that were influenced by exploration and colonization. Finally we will launch Unit 2, The Road to Independence and begin by investigating the French and Indian War and Colonial Response to

Our Environmental Issue Focus Groups will be working on a variety of tasks that directly relate to their topic, and enable them to gain an "expert level" of understanding that they will then share with the rest of the class. As a cooperative group of active learners and doers, the students will work together following a checklist to assure completion of all components of their tasks.



ELA – We will finish Monster by Walter Dean Myers and begin our second novel, A Long Walk to Water, by Linda Sue Park.. Nonfiction articles related to the topic of each novel will accompany our reading.

Math – Go Math Modules 4 & 5; Buckle Down Unit 2: Lessons 7-10

Science - Students will be URGED to continue researching their Focus Group topic beyond our set time together. Students can use the school library during lunch, can use our Science room during open lunch periods, and can continue independent research on their topic at home. Resources will be provided in class for use during scheduled class periods.

Students should be checking Google Classroom every night for Social Studies homework and school wide reminders. Videos are being posted as studying resources. They are also encouraged to conduct their own research projects outside of school for extra credit and can design their own research questions.

On November 15 and 16 the NYC Parks Urban Park Rangers will be enriching our curriculum with an informative ECOLOGY program to our classroom. They will then take us into the field for an exploration hike in the SI Greenbelt on November 29 and 30. Details to will be forthcoming.
