Dear Middle School Parents,

I am happy to say we can put another smooth school opening in the books! I hope you took the opportunity to meet your child's teachers at our annual Back to School event. I have included our teacher information sheet in this newsletter for your easy reference. It has been a joy to see the fresh faces of September. I am looking forward to a fantastic year with this remarkable group of middle school students.

The students look great in their school uniforms. As per our school uniform policy, <u>ALL</u> students are required to wear uniforms every day to school. The uniform policy consists of a light blue top with navy blue bottoms, a school physical education uniform, or school spirit wear. I will continue to have incentives for students in compliance with the uniform policy. I will also continue to use the "*Citywide Standards of Intervention and Discipline Measures*" if a student is not in compliance. The infraction code is B02 – "Failing to wear the required school uniform (applies only to students in grades 6 - 12 in schools that have adopted a school uniform policy and whose parents have not secured an exemption.) Students not in compliance with the school uniform policy will receive a warning letter as a courtesy.

An important school wide goal is to continue our partnerships with parents during this school year and to have open lines of communication. This partnership has been recognized as being paramount to the success of our students. I believe opening our classrooms and inviting parents to experience our innovative learning activities with their children is informative and fun. #### What topics will the students learn today?

ELA - During the month of October the students will study Monster by Walter Dean Myers. They will determine the important themes in the text in preparation for a thematic essay. They will continue to work on annotation, citation of textual evidence and analysis of point of view.

Math - This month the students will learn to apply and extend their previous understanding of operations to add, subtract, multiply and divide rational numbers. They will also learn to solve real-world and mathematical problems involving the four operations with rational numbers.

Science - In October the students will finish Chapter 2 and begin Chapter 3 by learning the difference between a rock and a mineral. They will learn about properties that are used to identify minerals and use different materials to help them identify minerals and rocks. They will also learn about the formation of rocks and how they are constantly being changed through the rock cycle.

Social Studies - This month our Social Studies Scholars will be exploring Native Americans, Early European Encounters and Colonial Developments. We will be examining the complexity of indigenous cultures in North America prior to European exploration through a Google Slides group research project exploring the impact of Columbus and participating in a class court case entitled "The People Vs. Columbus, et al.", exploring the role that Africans and women had on the American Colonies and investigating the three colonial regions in America. Our month will conclude with a document-based informational writing task focused on the themes of wealth, power and morality that were influenced by exploration and conization.
