Socialization is paramount in the life of an adolescent. Sociologists have noted its importance for a long time. "In order to build gratifying human relationships, it is vital that children learn and have the opportunity to practice social skills considered appropriate." We are happily planning some social activities to celebrate Halloween in middle school! On Thursday, October 31, 2019 we will be having a Middle School Halloween Party. This event will be held on the athletic field from 1:00 - 2:15pm. We will have DJ entertainment, candy, prizes and blow up rides for students. The cost will be \$10 per student. A permission slip will be forthcoming. I am happy to see so many families supporting our school uniform policy.

As per our school uniform policy, ALL students are required to wear uniforms every day to school. The uniform policy consists of a light blue top with navy blue bottoms, a school physical education uniform, or school spirit wear. I will continue to have incentives for students in compliance with the uniform policy. I will also continue to use the "Citywide Standards of Intervention and Discipline Measures" if a student is not in compliance. The infraction code is B02 – "Failing to wear the required school uniform (applies only to students in grades 6 - 12 in schools that have adopted a school uniform policy and whose parents have not secured an exemption.) Students not in compliance with the school uniform policy will receive a warning letter as a courtesy.

Petrides PAWS Points Tracker sheets were explained and distributed to all middle school students. Students can earn points for PAWS behavior throughout the month. Our reward token store will be open during the first week of November. We have also implemented an ATTENDANCE INCENTIVE where official classes can earn paws points for 100% attendance daily.

Our PAL after school program is well underway. I am excited to see so many students in attendance! In order for students to participate in our free after school program, they must complete a PAL application. Applications are available online at petridesschool.com or in my office. The program runs from 2:30 to 6:00 daily and students can attend only part time if desired.

What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – In October, students will continue reading *Monster* by Walter Dean Myers. One focus is on the author's use of structure to enhance meaning in the text. We will also analyze the themes that develop throughout the novel and gather text evidence to support our thematic essays. At the same time, we continue to learn narrative techniques that can be used to enhance our memoirs. Peer and self-assessment will prepare us to publish our memoirs at the end of the month.

Math – This month the students will learn to apply and extend their previous understanding of operations to add, subtract, multiply and divide rational numbers. They will also learn to solve real-world and mathematical problems involving the four operations with rational numbers

Science – We have been led by the NYC Urban Park Rangers along the trails of the SI Greenbelt, and have been introduced to some of the affects that human impact can have on our natural areas. We will continue this study as we become familiar with the Principles of Ecology in preparation for our 8th Grade Living Environment Regent next year.

Social Studies - This month our Social Studies Scholars will be exploring Native Americans, Early European Encounters, and Colonial Developments. We will be examining the complexity of indigenous cultures in North America prior to European exploration through a Google Slides group research project. Next, students will explore the impact of Columbus and participate in our first Socratic Seminar. We will also be analyzing the role that Africans and women had on the American colonies, and investigate the three colonial regions in America.



REMINDERS!

Students should come to Math class prepared with a pencil and a calculator every day.

Students are <u>required</u> to have a SCIENCE FOLDER and a designated area for SCIENCE NOTES every day in class. Families are urged to encourage students to question how and why the world works around them. Questioning will help young scientists expand their knowledge.

All SS tests are aligned to the U.S. History and Government Regents and each will be administered over two days. This includes both multiple-choice and a thematic essay. All tests will have review sessions/sheets. Students should be checking Google Classroom daily for SS announcements, reminders, video clip reviews, and HW. If students would like to keep a S.S. textbook at home to study from, please let Mr. Giordano know. Students are encouraged to conduct their own research projects outside of school for SS extra credit and can design their own research questions.
