What topics will the students learn today?

ELA –In December we will begin reading our next novel *The Outsiders* by S.E.Hinton. We will focus on gathering evidence to understand the setting and the theme of the text.

Math – This month the students will expand their understanding of equivalent expressions as they apply the properties of operations to write expressions in both standard and factored form. The students will also use variables to represent qualities in real-world or mathematical problems and construct simple equations to solve problems by reasoning about the quantities.

Science – The students will begin their study of the cell during the month of December. They will identify and label the parts of the cell and describe how all parts work together to maintain homeostasis. The students will also explain the differences between passive and active transport and they will perform lab experiments using the microscope. The students will also be investigating diffusion and osmosis.

Social Studies – During the month of December we will be studying the Industrial Revolution. The students will analyze Primary Source information related to America in the late 1800's and early 1900's.
