## What topics will the students learn today?



ELA – Students will finish reading *The Outsiders* by S.E. Hinton while completing a unit of study packet pertaining to the book. The packet covers skills such as vocabulary, context clues, theme, author's purpose as well as reader response questions. The students have also begun working on an argumentative essay that will include a claim, a counterclaim and a rebuttal.

Math – During the month of February our 7<sup>th</sup> grade students will continue to solve multi-step equations and inequalities as well as graphing inequalities. This month our 8<sup>th</sup> graders will continue to solve and determine the slope and graph linear functions on graphs and in the graphing calculators.

Science – Students will continue their study of Genetics in February. They will describe the structure of DNA and how its message is carried to the ribosomes for protein synthesis. They will identify reasons for genetic disorders through the study of the various types of mutations. The students will also learn how to read a DNA fingerprint and explain how DNA is used in the study of forensics,


