On exam days (stated above) they will report to their official class teacher for period 1. They will be dismissed from that room at the conclusion of their testing. They will then proceed to regularly scheduled classes.

The New York State Math Assessment is scheduled for Tuesday, May 1, 2018 and Wednesday, May 2, 2018.

The end of the third marking period is April 12, 2018.

I am very pleased with the number of students who chose to become members of our National Junior Honor Society. Students will be notified of their acceptance on April 20, 2018. Our ceremony will be held in May. The date will be forthcoming.

Preparations for end of year ceremonies and celebrations are well underway. The eighth grade end of year letter outlining dates and costs is attached to this newsletter. What topics will the students learn this month?



ELA – Students will read nonfiction books on their reading level within small book club groups. Each book will be on a different topic from the Holocaust. The students will have in depth book discussions about what they learn and the impact of this tragic event on specific groups of people. As a culminating project, each group will create a slideshow presentation teaching the other groups about their topic.

Math – We just finished our last topic of recursive and explicit rules for arithmetic and geometric sequences. We will begin to review all topics (starting from September) for the June 12th Algebra 1 Regents exam.

Science – This month the students will begin their journey through the human body. They will identify the major organ systems in the body and describe how each organ works. They will also describe various disorders and diseases associated with each system and discuss how disease is a failure to maintain homeostasis.

Social Studies – During the month of April the students will understand the causes of World War I. They will also learn about life during the 1092s and the causes of The Great Depression.
