What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – During the month of December we will finish our Edgar Allan Poe unit with *The Raven*. We will be analyzing the poem for the figurative meaning and breaking down the poem into 21st century language. Culminating this unit the students will have to write an essay choice on tone, mood, and symbolism and how Poe's life parallels his writing. Our upcoming unit will be John Steinbeck's *Of Mice and Men*.

Math – During the month of December the students will learn how to graph linear, quadratic and exponential functions on the graphing calculator.

Science – This month the students will begin their study of the cell. They will identify and label the parts of the cell and describe how all parts work together to maintain homeostasis. They will also explain the difference between passive and active transport. During December the students will perform lab experiments using the microscope and investigate diffusion and osmosis.

Social Studies – The students will learn the causes of the Civil War and the reason for slavery in the South.

Students should review Math notes on a nightly basis and bring in graphing calculator to school every day.
