What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – This month we will complete our *Of Mice and Men* unit where we have been focusing on determining themes in literature. We have been using Google Classroom documents to keep track of interactions between characters and the theme topics that are proven. We are now working on writing a thematic essay in MLA format.

Math – We will begin to explore quadratics equations- which are u-shaped curves. We will be learning how to graph these "parabolas" on coordinate planes. The different properties of the quadratic functions will also be analyzed.

Science – Students will complete their study of reproduction in February and begin their study of how human traits are inherited. They will identify the parts of DNA, explain how DNA replicates, produces in RNA and how it translates to an amino acid sequence eventually producing a protein (trait). They will perform a simulated gel electrophoresis lab and connect the theory of evolution to the pattern of inherited traits. They will also explain how DNA is used in the field of Forensic Science.

Social Studies – During the month of February the students will study post World War II America. They will also learn about the Civil Rights Movement and Leaders, The Brown v. Board of Education (Topeka) case. They will also be working on a Thematic Essay this month.
