I am VERY EXCITED to announce that Habitat for Humanity Club will be working with middle school students for a talent show/lip sync competition on February 13, 2019. Our first Middle School "Spotlight Fight" will be fantastic. Students can perform in groups or individually. I want to encourage as many students as possible to participate. There will be multiple rehearsal opportunities for each grade level. Rehearsals are on the attached calendar. Acts must be limited to 2 minutes. More information will be forthcoming.

Our National Junior Honor Society students have been working hard this year. They have visited Clove Lakes Nursing Home, organized the Box Top campaign and did volunteer gift wrapping in the Staten Island Mall. National Junior Honor Society applications are available in my office. Students in grades 6, 7 and 8 are encouraged to apply. Students can earn community service hours during our PAL after school program. Ms. Calimano meets with 7th grade members on Tuesday each week. 8th grade members can meet every Wednesday and 6th grade students applying can meet on Fridays after school in Room B204. After school participation is not mandatory but those students who work on the community service projects after school go on trips to culminate each endeavor.

We are organizing a Middle School Bowling League for students in collaboration with our PAL after school program. Bowlers will meet at Rabs Country Lanes starting Tuesday, January 8, 2019. Bowling will be every Tuesday for eight weeks. Bowling is open to the first twenty students who would like to participate. The cost is \$60 charge. There are still seats available to students in grades 6 - 8 for our PAL after school program. What topics will the students learn this month?

ELA - During the month of January, we will be exploring John Steinbeck's novella, Of Mice and Men. In this short novel, we will see how life and historical events of the early 1900's were portrayed through migrant workers in Southern California. John Steinbeck uses literary devices such as foreshadowing, imagery, and symbolism to create this realistic and interesting piece of classic literature.

Math – We just finished factoring expressions and we will now be exploring quadratic equations. We will use some of the factoring methods to find the zeros/solutions to quadratics.

Science – This month the students will continue and complete their study of reproduction. They will identify reproduction anatomy and describe the function of each part. They will discuss the differences between internal and external fertilization and describe advantages and disadvantages for both. They will also describe how the menstrual cycle prepares the female's body for pregnancy and will discuss the different stages of pregnancy and birth. The students will also discuss disease as a failure of homeostasis. Included in this unit is our mandated sexual education lesson.

Social Studies – During the month of January our 8th Grade students will begin studying World War I. We will analyze primary source documents and political cartoons from that era.
