What topics will the students learn today?



ELA – Students will be preparing for the NYS ELA Exam by critically thinking about nonfiction and fictional reading passages while annotating and answering comprehension questions. During this month, students will also be participating in book clubs by reading books based on events during the Holocaust. Students are expected to independently read, take notes, and participate within their small groups.

Math – We have just finished analyzing quadratic equations. We will now begin to explore piecewise graphs of linear, quadratic and absolute value functions. Piecewise graphs will build upon previous functions. We will also be analyzing geometric and arithmetic sequences to identify patterns in numbers.

Science – Students will delve into the topic of genetics for the month of March. They will learn about Gregor Mendel and his work with pea plants and apply this knowledge to complete Punnett squares predicting possible offspring outcome. Students will identify DNA as the hereditary material in every cell. They will describe its structure. They will explain how it replicates. They will be able to describe how the code in the DNA molecule results in the production of a protein. They will analyze samples of DNA to identify mutations and will be able to determine if the mutation causes a genetic defect by comparing sample sequences.

Social Studies – During the month of March the students will continue studying the Civil Rights Movement and all aspects of the Cold War.


