Dear Middle School Parents,

I am happy to say we can put another smooth school opening in the books! I hope you took the opportunity to meet your child's teachers at our annual Back to School event. I have included our teacher information sheet in this newsletter for your easy reference. It has been a joy to see the fresh faces of September. I am looking forward to a fantastic year with this remarkable group of middle school students.

The students look great in their school uniforms. As per our school uniform policy, <u>ALL</u> students are required to wear uniforms every day to school. The uniform policy consists of a light blue top with navy blue bottoms, a school physical education uniform, or school spirit wear. I will continue to have incentives for students in compliance with the uniform policy. I will also continue to use the "*Citywide Standards of Intervention and Discipline Measures*" if a student is not in compliance. The infraction code is B02 – "Failing to wear the required school uniform (applies only to students in grades 6-12 in schools that have adopted a school uniform policy and whose parents have not secured an exemption.) Students not in compliance with the school uniform policy will receive a warning letter as a courtesy.

An important school wide goal is to continue our partnerships with parents during this school year and to have open lines of communication. This partnership has been recognized as being paramount to the success of our students. I believe opening our classrooms and inviting parents to experience our innovative learning activities with their children is informative and fun. ELA – During the month of October the students will be writing a narrative based on a message they want to send to their reader. Their story should be realistic or historical fiction or a memoir. I want their stories to come alive with their characters and descriptions of their setting,

Math – In September the students learned how to simplify polynomials by multiplying, subtracting and adding expressions. During the month of October the students will expand on this topic by solving multi-step equations and inequalities.

Science – The students will identify how an ecosystem is shaped by the non-living environment as well as its interacting species. They will also analyze food webs, food chains, and energy pyramids. The students will then categorize organisms into groups based on feeding habits and will identify and describe symbiotic relationships. They will also discuss how humans are negatively affecting our environment and propose ways to reverse the damage!

Social Studies – During the month of October the students will understand the compromises during the writing of the U S Constitution and the precedents set by George Washington. They will also learn about the unpopular Presidency of John Adams and the Louisiana Purchase by Thomas Jefferson.
