I am happy to see so many families supporting our school uniform policy. As per our school uniform policy, **ALL** students are required to wear uniforms every day to school. The uniform policy consists of a light blue top with navy blue bottoms, a school physical education uniform, or school spirit wear. I will continue to have incentives for students in compliance with the uniform policy. I will also continue to use the "*Citywide Standards of Intervention and Discipline Measures*" if a student is not in compliance. The infraction code is B02 – "Failing to wear the required school uniform (applies only to students in grades 6 – 12 in schools that have adopted a school uniform policy and whose parents have not secured an exemption.) Students not in compliance with the school uniform policy will receive a warning letter as a courtesy.

Petrides PAWS Points Tracker sheets were explained and distributed to all middle school students. Students can earn points for PAWS behavior throughout the month. Our reward token store will be open during the first week of November.

Our PAL after school program is well underway. I am excited to see so many students in attendance! In order for students to participate in our free after school program, they must complete a PAL application. A

pplications are available online at petridesschool.com or in my office. The program runs from 2:30 to 6:00 daily and students can attend only part time if desired.

What topics will the students learn today?

ELA – In October students will continue to detect themes across literature, such as perseverance, overcoming obstacles and heroes with our central texts *Lightning Thief* and *Wonder*. The students will cycle through the writing process and create a narrative about “Everyday Heroes.”

Math – Our sixth graders will be working on the Number System. The students will apply and extend previous understandings of multiplication and division to divide fractions by fractions. Also we will learn to compute fluently with multi-digit numbers and find common factors and multiples.

Science – This month the students will apply the laws of conservation of energy to energy transformations and identify how energy changes form. The students will also explain what renewable, non-renewable and alternative resources are. In addition, they will describe the advantages and disadvantages of using various energy sources.

Social Studies – This year students will explore how the early civilizations of the Eastern Hemisphere developed. The first unit will examine the impact climate and geography had on developing cultures.
