<u>Directions</u>: Fill in the following boxes with text details and inferences from the book while you are reading.

<u>Step 1</u>: While reading, find quotes that stand out to you as being important. Use the analysis questions to help guide your thinking and choice of quotes.

<u>Step 2</u>: When you find an important quote, stop, write down the page number and the direct quote that you want to analyze in Columns 1 and 2 in the graphic organizer.

<u>Step 3</u> You should answer at least one or two of the analysis questions in the 3rd column to explain why you chose this quote.

This dream portrays his frightening feelings throughout the court proceedings. Steve is unable to explain his story due to the justice system at the time. He had to give up control and rely on O'Brien to tell what happened. Steve feels trapped in his own thoughts, which further aggravates his feeling of separation.
