<u>Directions:</u> Fill in the following boxes with text details and inferences from the book while you are reading.

<u>Step 1:</u> While reading, find quotes that stand out to you as being important. Use the analysis questions to help guide your thinking and choice of quotes.

<u>Step 2</u>: When you find an important quote, stop, write down the page number and the direct quote that you want to analyze in Columns 1 and 2 in the graphic organizer.

<u>Step 3:</u> You should answer at least one or two of the analysis questions in the 3rd column to explain why you chose this quote.

EXAMPLE RESPONSE: Pg. 22	EXAMPLE : "I volunteer! I volunteer as tribute!" (Collins, p. 22)	EXAMPLE: In The Hunger Games, when Katniss says, "I volunteer! I volunteer as tribute!" (Collins, p. 22), it really surprised me because she risks her own life to protect her sister. My first thought was that Katniss is very brave and selfless. This passage makes me think about times when people have to make difficult choices to help their family or community. It also reminds me of how geography affects people's lives because Katniss lives in District 12, a poor mining area, which shapes her tough and protective nature. I wonder how her environment influences her actions throughout the story. I feel inspired by her courage but also worried about the dangers she will face.
