WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

Literacy:

Word Study – In February, students will be introduced to the difference between a blend and a digraph, suffix –s, r-controlled vowel sounds, vowel team sounds, and opened and closed syllables. They will continue to learn and read high-frequency words in context.

There is a spelling test at the end of each week. Students are responsible for knowing previous weeks and current week words!! Parents are to sign and return test on Monday.

Reading Workshop - February theme: "Arthur" author study. Students will continue to work on story elements (beginning, middle, end, character, setting, sequencing events, problem, solution).

This can also be practiced at home while reading with your child.

*Please continue to read daily with your child - encourage him/her to use print strategies to figure out difficult words, retell the story in sequence (beginning, middle, end) using temporal words (first, next, then and last) and ask questions about the text.

Writing Workshop - Writers will use what they learn in literacy to write letters.

Technology:

During the month of February, your child will be focusing on both keyboarding and mouse skills as well as proper use of the Internet. We will be using online tools to help maximize these skills. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed.

What's New in Performing Arts?

Ms. Eliot: First Grade students are finishing up their very own Musical Instrument Books! They have learned all about each instrument family and how they all produce sound differently. They also know what they all look and sound like! We will continue to listen and learn about different sounds and styles of music.

Ms. Granatelli (332): During the month of February students will focus on drawing, painting and collage.

Ms. LaGrotta (332): During dance class in February, first grade classes will be continuing identifying and demonstrating isolated dance moves of various body parts, locomotor and non-locomotor movements, and dancing with different tempos and rhythms.

Math:

Module 3 – Ordering and Comparing Length Measurements as Numbers. Topics include: Indirect Comparison in Length Measurement, Standard Length Units, Non-Standard and Standard Length Units, and Data Interpretation.

Much of the new Common Core Math Curriculum focuses on math talk. When doing math homework have your child explain their steps and give reasons for what they do to solve the problem.

It is important that students start learning their math addition facts to 20 by rote. They should start by learning their doubles facts and ways to make 10 facts.

Continue working with your child recognizing their numbers up to 100.
