## WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

## Literacy:

**Word Study -** In December students will continue the sound associations for the long vowels. Students will identify words with long vowel sounds. They will continue to learn and read high-frequency words in context.

There is a spelling test at the end of each week. Students are responsible for knowing previous weeks and current week words!! Parents are to sign and return test on Monday.

**Reading Workshop**- January theme: animals in winter. Students will read information texts in search of answers to questions.

Social Studies content is taught through literacy. Learners will explore a variety of informational texts while asking and answering questions.

Please continue to read daily with your child – encourage him/her to use print strategies to figure out difficult words, retell the story in sequence and ask questions about the text. Encourage your child to read more non-fiction. These books can be about true events and real people or animals.

**Writing Workshop** - Writers will create one information piece on a topic.

#### Math:

 $\underline{\text{Unit 5}}$  – Developing understanding of addition, subtraction, and strategies for addition and subtraction within 20.

Domain: **Operations and Algebraic Thinking**: Represent and solve problems involving addition and subtraction.

<u>Unit 6</u> - Developing understanding of whole number relationships and place value, including grouping in tens and ones.

Domain: Number and Operations in Base Ten: extend the counting sequence.

Much of the new Common Core Math Curriculum focuses on math talk. When doing math homework have your child explain his steps and give reasons for what he does to solve the problem using the math vocabulary for the unit.

#### Technology:

Your child will continue practicing their keyboarding and mouse skills, typing, resources used for research, and proper use of the Internet. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed. In the month of January we will be focusing primarily on mouse and keyboarding skills.

## What's New in Music and Art?

Ms. LaMorte: Students will analyze music (Major/Minor/Duple/Triple), learn/sing about Dr. Martin Luther King (work in singing groups), and study pieces for upcoming play.

**Ms. Eliot:** Students will revisit some favorite songs to review rhythms and movements with music.
