### WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

### Literacy:

Word Study - In December students will continue the sound associations for the long vowels. Students will identify words with long vowel sounds. They will continue to learn and read high-frequency words in context.

There is a spelling test at the end of each week. Students are responsible for knowing previous weeks and current week words!! Parents are to sign and return test on Monday.

**Reading Workshop**- January theme: dinosaurs. Students will read information texts in search of answers to questions, use text features when reading informational text and identify the main topic and retell details of a text.

Science: Animals. Students will learn how dinosaurs are alike and different.

Please continue to read daily with your child - encourage him/her to use print strategies to figure out difficult words, retell the story in sequence and ask questions about the text. Encourage your child to read more non-fiction. These books can be about true events and real people or animals.

**Writing Workshop** - Writers will write a question and answer piece about dinosaurs.

#### Math:

 $\underline{\text{Unit 6}}$  – Developing understanding of whole number relationships and place value, including grouping in tens and ones.

Domain: Number and Operations in Base Ten: extend the counting sequence.

Much of the new Common Core Math Curriculum focuses on math talk. When doing math homework have your child explain his steps and give reasons for what he does to solve the problem using the math vocabulary for the unit.

### Technology:

During the month of January, your child will be focusing on both keyboarding and mouse skills as well as proper use of the Internet. We will be using online tools to help maximize these skills. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed.
